

Manitoulin Youth Camp Expectations & Consent Form

The expectation is that young people (older teens and younger teens) come to the Bible Camp with a spiritual outlook, engage in positive and respectful behaviour, and strive to be a positive example to fellow attendees throughout the course of the week.

To this end, we ask that all teens agree to the following expectations, prior to arriving. <u>We also ask that parents</u> <u>please have a conversation with their child(ren) to reinforce these expectations prior to the Camp, and sign this</u> <u>form.</u> It should be mailed in along with your other registration forms to: Joe and Kate Abel 398707 5th Line, Melancthon, ON, L9V 1S3, Canada <u>by **April 1, 2019.**</u>

- □ Young people will show respect to their counsellors and to all aunts and uncles at the Bible Camp.
- □ Young people will not cause harm or distress of any kind to another person
- Young people will participate in all classes and scheduled activities unless their counsellor has given them permission to miss due to very unusual circumstances (i.e. illness).
- Young people are prohibited from having in their possession and/or consuming: alcohol, drugs and cigarettes (including e-cigarettes and vapes).
- If a young person will be bringing prescription medication or has an allergy that requires an epi-pen, parents are asked to notify the committee in advance of the Camp.
- Young people will avoid using iPods/iPads, tablets, and cellular/smart phones (of all makes and models) during the Camp. These devices should be given to their counsellors at the beginning of the week and will be returned at the end.
- □ Young people are not permitted to go beyond the bounds of the camp.
- Young people are to be respectful of Camp property and the property of their counsellors. No property is to be damaged or tampered with.
- Sound people will remain on their campsite during the night except to use the washroom.
- □ Young people are not permitted to be in the tent of the opposite gender at any time.
- Young people will consider that the decisions that they make have an impact on the other campers. The expectation is that all young people will make wise choices and strive to be a positive influence on other attendees.

If a young person is found to be in violation of any of the above rules, they will be asked to leave the Camp and it will be the responsibility of the parents to make arrangements for travel home.
