YOUTH CAMP 2010 - JUNIOR WORKBOOK - Introduction and Instructions

Welcome to being a Junior at Youth Camp! This may be your first time as a camper at Youth Camp - how exciting! Or, you may have been there last year and now you know all about being a camper!

We have an exciting opportunity to study the life of faithful Esther. We recommend that you read through the book of Esther with your family as you begin your workbook to get familiar with the story.

There are 3 parts to your pre-camp assignment. We recommend that you get started as soon as possible - don't put it off to start 'later'!

Part A - The Workbook

There are three types of questions you will come across in this workbook.

Most are of the first type - straight forward questions requiring answers that can be found within the verses indicated. These are "fact questions". The King James Version has been used as the basis for these questions and any quotations, but please feel free to use whichever version you are most comfortable with.

The second type is labelled with the "TQ" symbol, which stands for "thought question" (or some like to call them 'tough questions!'). These are designed to make you think about the answer, so don't expect to find the answer in a specific verse. If you try really hard and still cannot figure out a good response to one of these "thought questions", then ask your Mom or Dad for some help. Actually, it's OK to ask them for help at any time. Do not be surprised if you can think of more than one answer for a "thought question" - that's just how they are! Don't worry about whether it's the 'correct' answer, simply write down what you think the best answer is.

The third type is labelled as a ✍️ DIARY ENTRY. Here you are to imagine yourself as Esther, writing a diary or journal entry. This is kind of like a "creative writing" assignment in school. There will be one of these at the end of most of the chapters.

Have fun and try to do your very best. You can do the puzzles any time you wish.

Part B - Special Project

You will present this project in a 5 minute presentation to your class during Youth Camp. (see further instructions on the next page)

Part C - Minute Meditation



Part B - Special Project Instructions

Here are some project ideas to choose from. When thinking about your class presentation, it is best to pick one small idea and do it well, rather than trying to fit too much information into 5 minutes.

1. A Map of the Exile of the Jews from the land of Israel to Babylon.
Be sure it is well labelled with key places.
2. A Map of the land that King Ahasuerus reigned over.
3. A study of life in Persia to understand where Esther lived.
(e.g. The Persian Empire, government, religion, artifacts that depict life in Persia etc.)
4. A timeline of the life of Esther. Include important events in the book of Esther and indicate the year of Ahasuerus' reign, and the month and day (if applicable) on which the events took place.
4. A Character Study of one of the following characters:
 - Esther
 - King Ahasuerus
 - Vashti
 - Haman
 - Mordecai
5. A theme or topic from the book of Esther: (for example)
 - faith
 - courage
 - trials
 - leadership
 - influences
6. Draw a detailed picture or make a model of one of the events in Esther's life.
7. Write a skit or short play based on one of the events in Esther's life.



107 JEWISH EXILES IN BABYLONIA



Who's Who in the Exile

Jehoiachin
Exiled from Jerusalem at 18, having ruled 3 months. Probably kept under house arrest until 37 years later given a place of honour in the royal court. Seen as important figure by the Jewish exiles. Probably died during the exile. (2 Kings 24: 1-15; 25: 27-30.)

Daniel
Exiled with King Jehoiachin. Selected for training to serve in the royal court of Babylon. Daniel rose to become head of the royal advisers. Later in the exile, he was put in charge of all the Empire's governors. Some traditions say he returned to Jerusalem at the end of exile.

Ezekiel
Exiled with King Jehoiachin. He prophesied the destruction of Jerusalem, and later, that the exiles would return to Jerusalem with its rebuilt temple. Probably died before the end of exile.

Esther and Mordecai
Exiled with King Jehoiachin. Esther became queen to Xerxes, the Persian emperor, not long before the return of Nehemiah to Jerusalem. With her cousin Mordecai, she prevented the persecution of Jews throughout the Persian Empire. Mordecai became a powerful figure in Xerxes' court.

Jeremiah
Forced to go to Egypt at the start of Judah's exile by a group who fled after killing the Babylonian governor of Judah. He spent the rest of his life in Egypt. (Jeremiah 43.)

Ezra
A high official in the Persian Empire - 'minister for Jewish affairs'. Emperor Artaxerxes I sent him to Jerusalem to reform the people there in accordance with Jewish Law. He led the fourth group of exiles home. (Ezra 7.)

Nehemiah
Cupbearer to Artaxerxes I, Nehemiah was sent by the emperor in 445BC to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. He led the third group of exiles home. (Nehemiah 1 - 2.)

Ordinary people
Many Jews in the exile became prosperous (see Ezra 2: 68-69). Living in ghettos in Babylon and other places, they stayed together. But despite their wealth they despaired at the loss of their land and heritage. Psalm 137 expresses their feelings.
