You will find this commentary helpful in answering these questions, but with any commentary you need to be careful how you use it remembering that it must agree and exhibit God's word in supporting its interpretations.

We pray that by working through the questions that not only will this make our class time more interesting and profitable but that it will help us all to help each other towards God's coming kingdom. So, start working on the booklet TODAY, do a little each day, and try to think why each question was asked.

Please do not go first to the suggested answers to the questions without first trying to answer the questions. Should you want more support after going to the suggested answer to the questions then go to the commentary.

### INTRODUCTION TO THE QUESTIONS

The beginning chapters of Genesis lay a foundation for Bible principles and beliefs, so important in 2014.

These questions are designed to make you think, and search your Bible. The verse by verse notes will help, giving you more technical information to support your answers.

Because we are exposed both to the world's beliefs and Church thinking, we are in danger of losing our Genesis foundations. Many who oppose evolution do so with an incorrect understanding of what Genesis really says. We have to be careful not to jump from one obvious error to an opposite extreme which may not be correct.

Technology is really changing everything, from the way we learn, to what we value, to how we think. For example, because of T.V., learning is often done through pictures, as compared to the written word. Books are not being read, and when they are, finding information is much more difficult, because the brain is used to being jolted by pictures. Since words just don't cut it any more, works like Elpis Israel, where the first 187 pages cover only the first three chapters in Genesis, are not assigned even as supplementary reading.

In Genesis, there are key questions, requiring good Scriptural answers. In Genesis chapter 1, they are:

- Q.1 When was this beginning?
- Q.2 Did God create the heavens and the earth in 24 hour days?
- Q.3 Were the sun, moon and stars created on the 4th day?
- Q.4 What about the pre-historic animals?

Unfortunately, even Christadelphians, are split on answering question number one, which in turn affects the answers to the other three questions.

Dr. Thomas' opinion is clear enough in <u>Elpis Israel</u> that the earth was much older than 6000 years, when he said:

"the fragments of the wreck of this PRE-Adamic world have been brought to light by geological research... that its organic remains, coal fields and strata belong to the ages before the formation of man, rather than to the era of the creation or the Noahic flood." (Elpis Israel, John Thomas, 14th ed., p.11)

On the other hand the "Creation Research Society" says that the creation of the universe and our globe were about 6000 years ago and what we see was only made to look old. In other words, when things were created, they were created with an appearance of age, as Adam who looked full grown, even though he was only minutes old. They think our earth, even though it looks old, is a "young earth" created about 6000 years ago.

We need to be able to answer these questions, and just referring to Dr. Thomas or the Creation Research Society will not work well in 2014, and rightly so. We must examine the evidence and draw valid conclusions. For example, the Creation Research Society's argument that God has the ability to create things looking old, doesn't prove that He did, -- or using Dr. Thomas' argument of coal fields and strata to prove that God didn't create the earth looking old, will not work either. No in 2014, we again must search the Scriptures to what God said, and the principles by which He operates.

How important is it? Well, Genesis provides the foundations to Bible faith. And, the faith of the Bible is not a blind faith, but a faith that has substance that gives evidence. In all of God's creation, we see evidence of purpose, order and direction, and basic laws of physics and science. Our faith in God is based on His word and His work of creation. Even though we sometimes can't see all aspects, we have faith that He will not change His principles and laws.

We must be cautious when reading material from sources such as the Creation Research Society. Their theology is not only sprinkled through their writings, but used to support their conclusions. For example in giving evidence against the "gap theory: they say:

".. if, according to the Gap Theory, all the animals and plants of the 'first world' were destroyed and fossilized, they would have no genetic relation to the living things of the present world, in spit of the fact that the majority of them appear to be identical in form to modern types. Likewise, those who place human fossils into this gap period are forced to the conclusion that such pre-Adamic men did not possess an eternal soul because they obviously died before sin entered the world by Adam."


