
ELIJAH AND THE RAVENS

1 Kings 17:1-9

Ahab was king of the ten tribes of Israel. All the kings of Israel's ten tribes had wickedly served idols, but Ahab was even more wicked than all who had been king before! He married a Gentile princess named Jezebel who worshipped Baal. Together they built a house for Baal and set up an altar for the children of Israel to worship Baal, too.

Instead of leading God's people to the water of the Word of God, Ahab and Jezebel led them far, far away from God.






One day, a hairy man with a leather girdle appeared to King Ahab. It was Elijah, the prophet of God and he had bad news for Ahab. "As the LORD God of Israel LIVES, there will be no more dew nor rain, until I give the word."

Ahab and Israel needed to realize that just like it is hard to live in a time of drought – when there is no rain and no dew – they also could never live without the water of God's Word either!

"Go, hide!" God said to Elijah. God knew that Elijah would now have to run for his life from Jezebel. "Go to the brook Cherith. The brook will give you water to drink, and I will send ravens to feed you there."





Ravens! Ravens were nasty little birds that ate whatever they could find, including yucky dead things. Under the Law of Moses, they were unclean animals. But that didn't matter to Elijah, because he knew that God sent them to take care of him. Every morning and every evening the ravens brought Elijah bread and flesh to eat.

After a while, the brook Cherith dried up because there had been no rain in the land. But Elijah could trust that God would still provide for him. "Arise," God said to Elijah, "Go to Zarephath in Zidon. Look, I have commanded a widow woman to provide for you there." Zidon! That was not a place in Israel. It was an unclean Gentile country – and the country that Jezebel came from, no less!





But Elijah went to Zidon, just as God commanded. He could trust that whether it was through unclean ravens or unclean Gentiles in Jezebel's hometown, God cared for him and would continue to provide for him.

Elijah obeyed God's commands and went wherever God told him to go. God first used unclean ravens and then a Gentile widow to provide for Elijah.

If we obey God's commands like Elijah, we can trust that God will always provide for us, too – sometimes in unexpected ways and through unexpected people!






• SECTION 2 •

ELIJAH AND THE WIDOW

1 Kings 17:10-24

In the country of Zidon, outside the city gate, a widow searched the dry ground for sticks. A hairy traveler from Israel arrived, obviously very thirsty. "Please," said the man, "will you get me a little water to drink?"

As she turned to get water for the thirsty traveler, she heard the voice call out again, "And please will you bring me just a little bit of bread?"






Sadly the widow turned around to the man, Elijah. "As the LORD your God lives, I only have a handful of flour and a little oil. Right now I am searching for two sticks, to bake it so that my son and I can have one last meal before we starve and die."

"Don't worry," Elijah said to her, "Make a cake for me, and afterwards you and your son. The LORD God of Israel has said that you will not run out of flour or oil until God sends the rain again."

The woman believed Elijah and his God, and she did as he had asked her. First she made Elijah a cake, and when she was finished there was still flour and oil – just as Elijah had said. And just as Elijah had promised, the flour and the oil did not run out.

Elijah stayed in the loft of the widow's house. God continued to provide food for the widow woman and her son. And she continued to provide food for Elijah.





After some time had passed, the widow's son became sick and died.

The distraught mother cried to Elijah, "What have I to do with you, O man of God? Are you here to punish my sins by killing my son?"

"Give him to me," Elijah said. He held the boy closely and carried him up to the loft and laid him on the bed.

Elijah stretched himself on the child three times, and prayed to God, "O LORD my God, I pray to You, please, let this child come to life again." Never before had someone been resurrected from the dead!

But God heard Elijah and just as Elijah had asked, the boy revived! Elijah took the boy back down to the house where his mother was, "Look! Your son is alive again!" Elijah said.





With joy the widow exclaimed, "I know now, that you ARE a man of God, and that God's words that you speak are true."

The poor widow had one last meal for her and her son before they would both starve to death. Because she obeyed God, and put Elijah's needs before her own she was blessed by God both with food and later with the resurrection of her son!


God wants us to seek the good of others, and not our own good (1 Cor. 10:24). He will reward us, too, when He sees that we are acting like the widow woman who put others before herself.






• SECTION 3 •

ELIJAH AT MOUNT CARMEL 1 Kings 18

Three and a half years passed since Elijah prayed that there would be no rain. The land became more and more dry.

Now it was time to see whether Ahab and the people of Israel had learned that they needed the water of God's Word. It was time to show them that the LORD – He is God!

It was time for Elijah to go speak with Ahab.






"Is that you, Elijah? The one who has been troubling Israel?" Ahab angrily exclaimed when he saw Elijah.

"I have not troubled Israel – you have, Ahab – you and your father's house! You have forsaken the true God and worshipped Baal!" replied Elijah. "Now send and gather all Israel to mount Carmel, and bring the four hundred and fifty prophets of Baal."

Ahab did as Elijah commanded. The children of Israel stood on mount Carmel early in the morning.

"How long will you go back and forth between serving God and serving Baal?" Elijah cried out to them, "If the LORD is the One True God, follow him! But if Baal is the True God, then follow him! You must make up your mind!"

"The prophets of Baal will prepare a sacrifice for Baal, and I will prepare a sacrifice to the LORD. Then you call to Baal, and I will call on the name of the LORD. Whoever answers with fire – He is the True God."








"Cry louder," Elijah mocked. "Maybe he's on a journey or sleeping and can't hear you!" Elijah knew the One True God never slumbers or sleeps and can always hear His children when they call.

The prophets cried louder. They began to cut themselves with knives to get Baal's attention. But there was no answer. Evening came, but still no answer from Baal.

"Come to me," Elijah called the children of Israel. It was time to show them that the LORD – He is God! God's altar had fallen apart since no one had sacrificed to God for so long. First Elijah must repair the altar. Then around the altar he made a trench. After putting the bull on the altar, he told the people to pour four barrels of water on the altar and the trench – one time, two times, three times. The altar was soaked. How could fire burn that?

"Hear me, O LORD!" Elijah prayed, "Hear me so that your people will know that YOU are the LORD and turn their hearts back to You again."





Suddenly, fire fell from heaven – it burned the sacrifice... AND the wood... AND the stones... AND the dust... it was all burnt up.

The contest was over. Stunned, the children of Israel fell on their faces. "The LORD, HE is God; the LORD, HE is God!" they cried.



• SECTION 4 •

ELIJAH AT MOUNT HOREB 1 Kings 19

After the fire from heaven burnt Elijah's sacrifice, the children of Israel could see that the LORD – He is God. "Kill the prophets of Baal!" Elijah commanded the children of Israel, "Let none of them escape."

Then Elijah spoke to Ahab. "Get up, Ahab!" he said, "Eat and drink for an abundance of rain is coming now!"

Because God's people had recognized Him as the True Living God, it was time for the drought to end.





But when Jezebel heard that the prophets of Baal had been killed, she was furious! "Send a messenger to Elijah," she cried angrily, "Tell him that he will be as dead as the prophets of Baal by tomorrow!"

Elijah ran for his life. He ran into the desert, and sat under a juniper tree. He was discouraged. He had hoped that after such a great miracle on mount Carmel, Jezebel and the worship of Baal would be completely overthrown. Now he was on the run from Jezebel again!

Elijah continued to journey and 40 days later came to mount Horeb (or mount Sinai – where Moses had met with God many years earlier).

"What are you doing here, Elijah?" God asked.

"The children of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, and thrown down Your altars. They have killed Your prophets with the sword!" Elijah cried, "I am the only one left and they are trying to take my life too!"

"Go, stand on mount Horeb." God told Elijah.





As Elijah stood on mount Horeb, a terrifying wind blew past, ripping the rocks off the mountain around Elijah! But God was not in the wind.

As the wind died down, the mountain where Elijah stood began to tremble with an earthquake! But God was not in the earthquake.


As the quaking began to calm down, a fire began to burn! But God was not in the fire.

When the fire stopped, Elijah heard a still small voice.

"What are you doing here, Elijah?" God asked again in the still small voice.

Again Elijah replied, "The children of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, and thrown down Your altars. They have killed Your prophets with the sword!" Elijah cried, "I am the only one left, and they are trying to take my life too!"

"Elijah, I still have work for you to do!" God said to Elijah. God's judgment would soon be coming to Jezebel and God wanted Elijah to anoint those who would destroy Jezebel and the Baal worshippers.

Elijah felt like he was the only one left who served God, but God showed him that there were many who were still serving God and provided for Elijah a friend in the truth.




• SECTION 5 •

ELIJAH AND THE WHIRLWIND 2 Kings 2

Some time had passed since Elijah had anointed Elisha. Ahab had been killed in battle, and his wicked son, Jehoram, was now king.

Although there were a few in Israel who served God, most continued to worship Baal.

But for now, Elijah's work was coming to its end. It was time for Elisha to become the new prophet to Israel.





Elisha had been a faithful friend who had stayed with Elijah from the time he had been anointed. But now Elijah spoke to Elisha, "Stay here, please, Elisha. God has sent me to Bethel."

But Elisha replied, "As the LORD lives, and as I live, I will not leave you." So both of them went to Bethel. In Bethel, Elijah again said, "Elisha, stay here, please. God has sent me to Jericho."

But Elisha replied, "As the LORD lives, and as I live, I will not leave you." So both of them went to Jericho.

In Jericho, Elijah again said, "Elisha, stay here, please. God has sent me to Jordan." But once again, Elisha replied, "As the LORD lives, and as I live, I will not leave you."

Elijah and Elisha came to the Jordan River where many, many years earlier the children of Israel had crossed to enter the Promised Land.

Elijah took his mantle off and hit the water of Jordan with it, and the Jordan River stopped, leaving dry ground – just as it had done for the children of Israel many years before.





Elijah and Elisha crossed on dry ground. "Elisha, what can I do for you, before I am taken away from you?" Elijah asked.

"Please," Elisha said, "Let a double portion of your spirit be upon me." God's spirit had enabled Elijah to perform miracles, and Elisha hoped God's spirit could work through him, too.

"That is a difficult thing that you have asked," Elijah said. "If you see when I am taken away, then it will be as you have asked. But if you cannot see me, then it won't."

Elijah and Elisha continued to walk and to talk together, when suddenly a chariot and horses of fire separated Elijah from Elisha! As Elisha watched, a whirlwind took Elijah into the sky.

"My father, my father!" Elisha cried as he tore his clothes in two. He would not see Elijah again.

But there was something Elijah had left behind – his mantle. Elisha picked up Elisha's mantle and walked back to the shore of the Jordan River. Did he have the spirit power from God like Elijah did? Had his request been answered?





Elisha raised the mantle and hit the Jordan River. And the Jordan River parted for Elisha. Yes, he too would have the power to perform miracles just as Elijah did.

For now Elijah's work is complete. Elisha picked up where Elijah left off showing God's people not only that "the LORD, He is God" (meaning of Elijah's name), but that He is a "God who Saves" (meaning of Elisha's name).


However, very, very soon Elijah will be resurrected to continue his work in a very special way. Elijah will be the first to go to the Jews in the land of Israel to prepare the way for Jesus to reveal himself to them. THIS time ALL Israel will know that the LORD, He is God! (Malachi 4:5-6).




