



1. COMPLETING THE WORKBOOK

- Don't forget to pray to God before you begin, asking for an open mind and heart so that you can understand what you are studying.
- This workbook will help you begin studying the life of Noah so that you understand the basic story and help you prepare for camp.
- The workbook is written using the King James Version (KJV) of the Bible. Feel free to look at other versions to help you understand the text.
- Start each section of questions by reading through the verses. This will help you familiarize yourself with the incident as a whole before you begin looking at the details.
- There are questions throughout the book with a **TQ** symbol, which stands for 'thought question' (or some like to call them tough questions!). These are designed to make you think about the answer, so don't expect to find the answer in a specific verse, just write down what you think.
- Read all the extra information in the workbook. There are different translations, word definitions and lots of other useful information which will help you to understand more about the story.
- Also enjoy the extra activities throughout the book, like word searches and mazes and feel free to color the pictures.
- If you are having trouble with a question, put a star next to it and move on to the next question. When you have completed the section, go back and try again. If you still can't get it, ask someone for help or email Uncle Jon and Auntie Becky at jbgore97@gmail.com or Auntie Joanna at mumugore@gmail.com
- **Bible Marking** - At the beginning of the workbook there are a number of pages of Bible marking for Genesis 5-9. The purpose of this Bible Marking is to color code the chapters of Genesis that we are studying so that we can more easily see what is going on in a chapter when we turn to it. It is always a good idea to read the chapter before you start Bible marking so that you understand what you are coloring.



Directions for Using a Strong's Concordance

1. Look up the word in the main concordance (the front section) just like you would in a regular dictionary.
2. Find the verse that contains the word you are looking for and look for a number to the right of the reference.
3. Use this number to look up the meaning in the back of the concordance. Because we are studying the Old Testament you will use the Hebrew dictionary in the back of the concordance.

2. MEMORY VERSES

There will be a memory verse from the life of Noah each day. You will be quizzed on the verse in the morning Bible readings quiz for that day. Below is the list of verses. We suggest that you start memorizing these verses before camp.

Monday - Hebrews 11:7

By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith.



Tuesday - Genesis 6:18

But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons' wives with thee.



Wednesday - Genesis 7:1-2

And the LORD said unto Noah, Come thou and all thy house into the ark; for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation. Of every clean beast thou shalt take to thee by sevens, the male and his female: and of beast that are not clean by two, the male and his female.



Thursday - Genesis 8:8-9

Also he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters were abated from off the face of the ground; But the dove found no rest for the sole of her foot, and she returned unto him into the ark, for the waters were on the face of the whole earth: then he put forth his hand, and took her, and pulled her in unto him into the ark.



3. BIBLE READINGS

The lessons and activities each day will be taken from specific portions of scripture from the life of Noah. Our readings cover the record of the life of Noah in Genesis and also a number of places where Noah or the flood are referred to in the New Testament. There will be a Bible readings quiz during the morning session.

Below is the list of readings that you will be quizzed on each day:

MONDAY – Genesis 5:21-6:7; Luke 17:20-37

TUESDAY – Genesis 6:8-22; 2 Peter 3:1-9

WEDNESDAY – Genesis 7; 1 Peter 3:15-22

THURSDAY – Genesis 8

FRIDAY – Genesis 9

We would recommend that every camper try to listen to or read all the Bible passages above at least five times before camp. This will help in understanding the story better and in preparing for the morning quizzes.



There are a variety of ways to do this. Here are a few suggestions:

- Read the Bible passages together as a family
- Listen to a dramatized version of the Bible passages, available on Bible Gateway, Podcasts, etc
- Play the Bible passages while you are driving in the car together
- Print out the Bible passages and have the children highlight important words and phrases in the stories

Color in a box every time you read/listen to all the Bible passages for the week.



4. MINUTE MEDITATION

We would love to have you prepare a Minute Meditation to share at virtual Youth Camp. It will need to be video recorded and emailed to us at jbgore97@gmail.com by **June 30, 2021** if you would like it to be shared at VMYC.

A Minute Meditation is an opportunity for you to meditate or think about a verse from the study and share what you have learned in approximately one minute. You will read the verse and then tell what you have learned from the verse. You can share what you have learned about God and His character, or what you have learned about the people in the verse, or how this verse relates to other verses in the Bible, or how it relates to your life or a combination of these ideas.

You will need to choose a passage on which to base your Minute Meditation. The passages are divided up by the first letter of your last name. Please find the first letter of your last name below and choose a verse from one of the passages listed next to that letter to use for your Minute Meditation.



In **2 Peter 3:18-21**, Peter talks about the "Spirit", which is God's power. In **verse 18** it was the Spirit, or God's power that 'quicken'd Christ from the grave, after he had been "put to death" on the cross. **Verse 19** describes how the same Spirit of God was also at work in Noah's day. What work did it do then? Working through Noah's preaching, it was God's Spirit (the same Spirit that raised Jesus) that warned the people of the coming flood. It wasn't Jesus that went and preached to these people because Jesus hadn't been born yet. Sadly, the people didn't listen to Noah's preaching and died in the flood. Peter refers to them as "spirits in prison" because they are like people condemned in prison with no way of escape. They will never come out of the grave to receive eternal life because they rejected Noah's preaching. God had been very patient (longsuffering) with the people of Noah's day, having given them the entire time the ark was being built, to repent and to join Noah and his family in the ark. But none accepted God's invitation or heeded the warning of the coming flood.

“the everlasting covenant” - This is a special term and relates to those eternal covenants of promise which are associated with “all flesh”, that is, with all nations. The expression is used in relation to Abraham as “the father of many nations” (Gen. 17:13, 19). The term is also used of the covenant made to David (2 Sam. 23:5). It is interesting to note that the term “everlasting covenant” is found just 14 times in the Old Testament (i.e. twice 7 times). In the New Testament it is found but once when Paul speaks of the work of the Lord Jesus Christ: “Now the God of peace that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus that great shepherd of the sheep through the blood of the everlasting covenant...” (Heb. 13:20)” - pg. 48 *Noah Preacher of Righteousness*, John Martin


