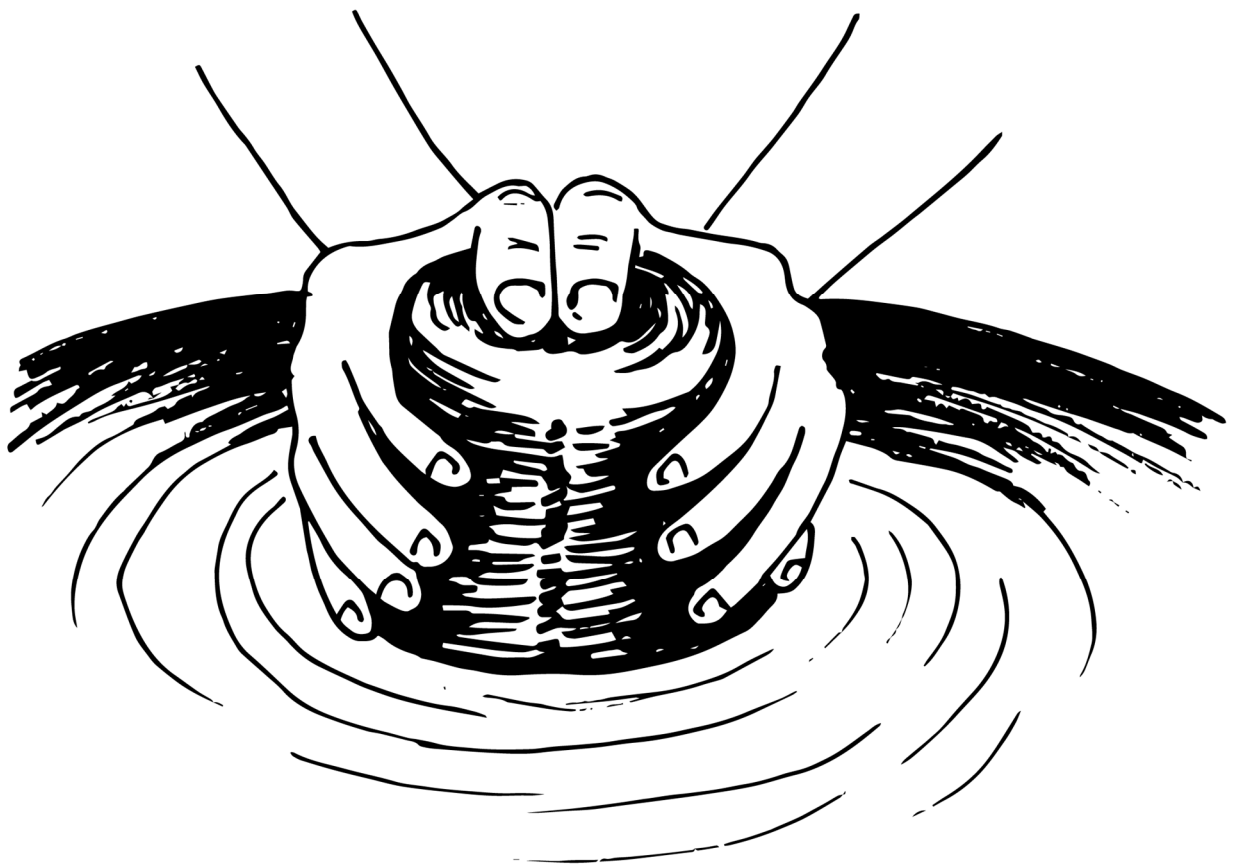


JEREMIAH

Dear Parents and Squirts,

We are excited that you are planning to join us for Camp this year!

This is an optional workbook to give the squirts the opportunity to feel a part of the lessons that their “big brothers” or “big sisters” are working on for camp. If your child turns 3, 4, or 5 by the end of 2023, then they would complete this “younger” squirt workbook. (If they are 6 - 8 by the end of 2023, then they would complete this “older” squirt workbook.)

While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal.



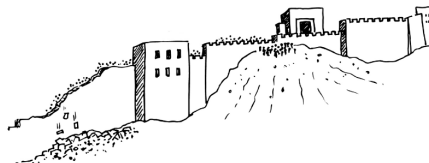

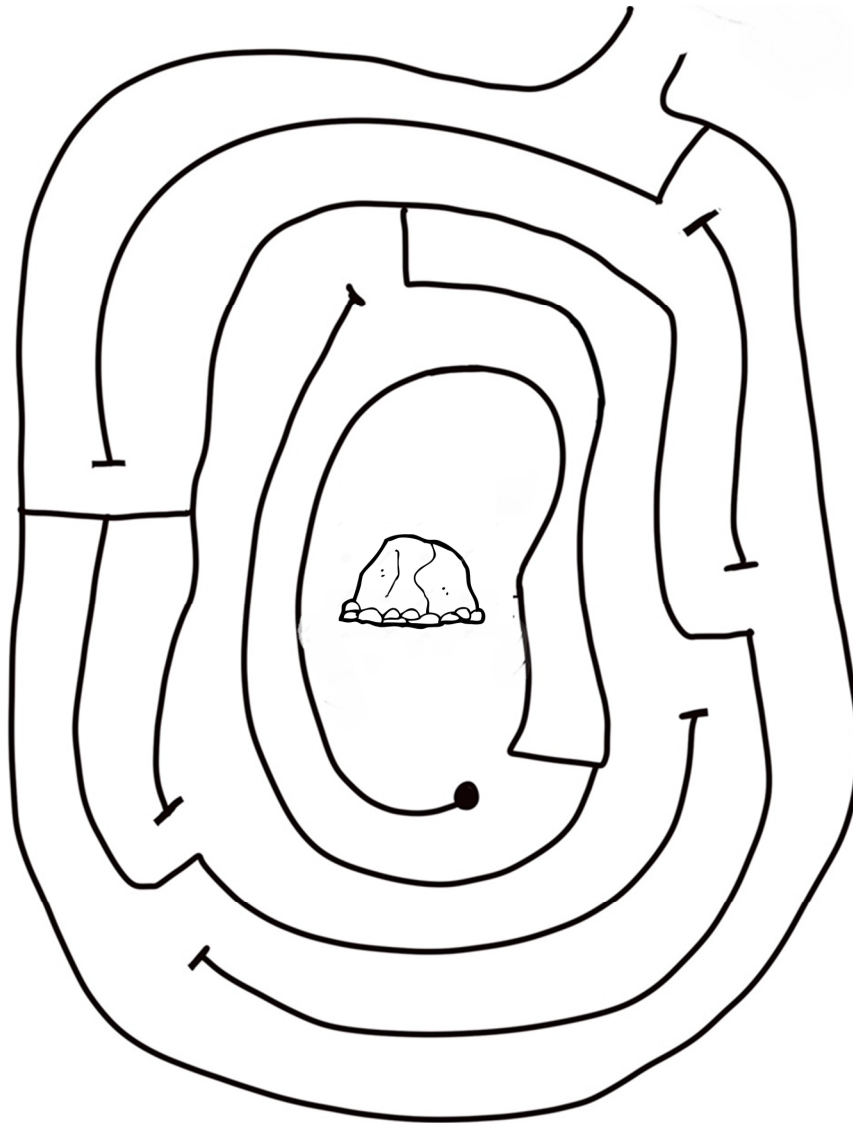

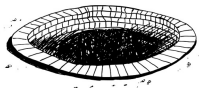
God. They did not like to hear that their sins made them useless to God and



that they would be thrown out of their land like a damaged vessel. They were



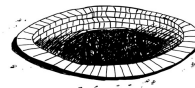
angry at Jeremiah. They threw Jeremiah down into a slimy, stinky, dark



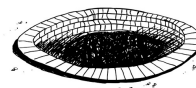

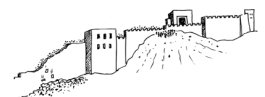
dungeon. But Jeremiah knew that he could trust in God. One of the king's

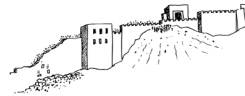
SECTION FIVE: JERUSALEM IS BURNED

they would finally choose to listen and obey God.

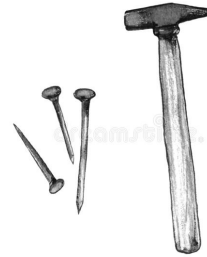
