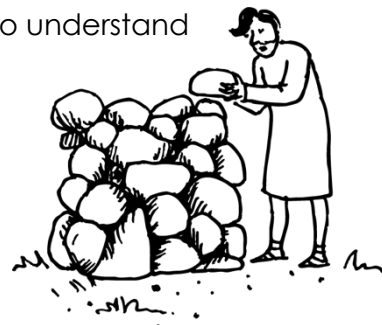

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1. Completing the Workbook

- Don't forget to pray to God before you begin, asking for an open mind and heart so that you can understand what you are studying.
- This workbook will help you begin studying the life of Jacob so that you understand the basic story and help you prepare for camp.
- The workbook is written using the King James Version (KJV) of the Bible. Feel free to look at other versions to help you understand the text.
- Start each section of questions by reading through the verses. This will help you familiarize yourself with the incident as a whole before you begin looking at the details.
- TQ = thought question. These are designed to make you think about Jacob's life and what it means to you, so don't expect to find the answer in a specific verse. Answer them in your own words.
- Read all the extra information in the workbook. There are different translations, word definitions and lots of other useful information which will help you to understand more about the story.
- Also enjoy the extra activities throughout the book, like word searches and mazes and feel free to color the pictures.
- If you are having trouble with a question, put a star next to it and move on to the next question. When you have completed the section, go back and try again. 2. Minute Meditation

You will need to prepare a Minute Meditation to present at camp. You will present it in your class, or you can volunteer to present it in the main pavilion. You will need to choose one verse on which to base your Minute Meditation.

A Minute Meditation is an opportunity for you to meditate or think about a verse from the study and share what you have learned in approximately one minute. You will read the verse and then tell what you have learned from the verse. You can share what you have learned about God and His character, or what you have learned about the people in the verse, or how this verse relates to other verses in the Bible, or how it relates to your life or a combination of these ideas.

The chapters are divided up by the first letter of your last name. Please find the first letter of your last name below and choose a verse from the chapter listed next to that letter to use for your Minute Meditation.

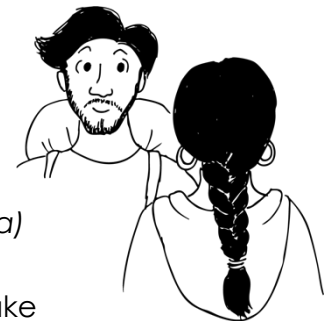

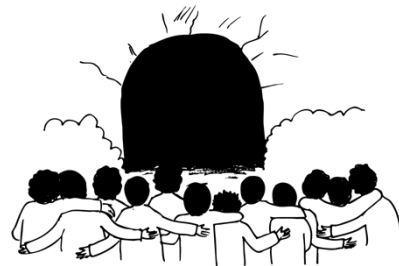

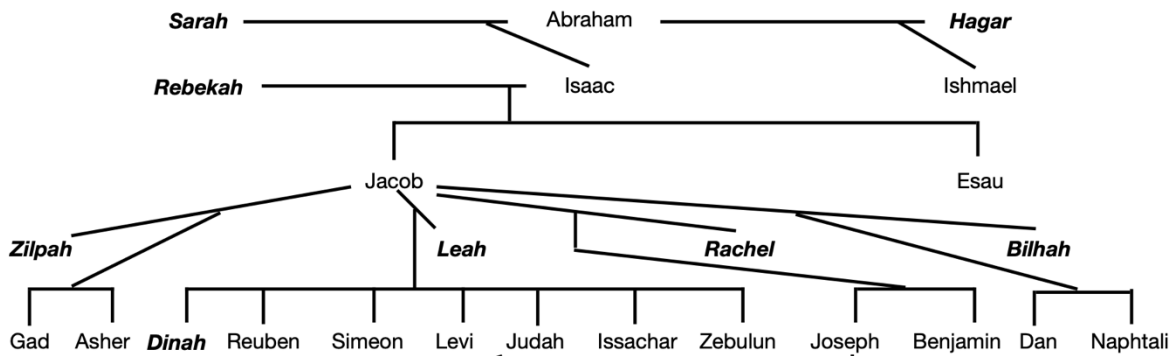

What does 'sod pottage' mean? The NKJV says "Jacob cooked a stew".

The word "Edom" is related to the Hebrew word for "red", like the "red pottage" Esau wanted in this story. "Red" would be a funny nickname for a person, wouldn't it? Edom became the name of a country southwest of Israel where Esau's descendants ended up. The "Edomites" come up in several stories later in the Bible, usually fighting with God's people. That land is in the country now called "Jordan".

What exactly did Jacob buy? The "birthright" or "the rights that belong to you as the oldest son in the family" (NirV) was not an actual object. It was more of a status or position, the job of being the oldest. In Bible times, the oldest son was the next leader in the family, and inherited extra stuff when his father died. In this family, there were also special blessings and responsibilities from God for the oldest son. It would be very strange to sell away your position as the oldest in the family. But it looks like that is what Jacob asked for, and what Esau did.

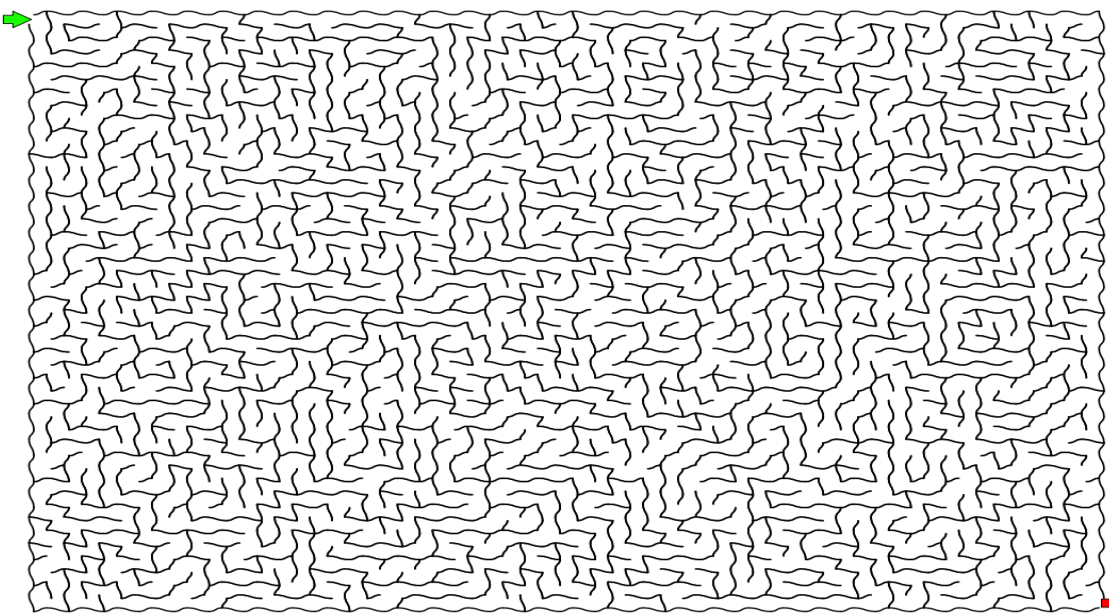

Before this, Esau had married two wives who were idol worshippers, and this had made Isaac and Rebekah very sad (Gen 26:34-35) Rebekah told Isaac that this was why she wanted Jacob to leave, so he could find a wife who didn't worship idols. But we know that she also wanted Jacob to get away from Esau, so Esau wouldn't kill him.**

Complete the tasks listed below on the map on the following page to follow Jacob's journeys throughout his life. Draw a line from city to city as you go along.

1. Jacob lived in Beersheba with his father Isaac, mother Rebekah and brother Esau (Gen. 28:10). **Draw a tent and family at Beersheba.**
2. Jacob left home and stopped in Bethel for the night. He laid his head on a stone for a pillow and had a dream about angels going down and up a ladder (Gen. 28:19). **Draw Jacob sleeping using a stone for a pillow at Bethel.**
3. Jacob travelled to Haran where his uncle Laban lived (Gen. 27:43). **Draw a house in Haran** (on the small map in the corner or where Haran is labelled on the large map).
4. Jacob lived in Haran for 20 years. When he left Laban's house, Laban chased after Jacob and his family and caught up with them at Galeed. Jacob and Laban made a covenant and Jacob had his men make a heap of stones (Gen. 31:47). **Draw a heap of stones at Galeed.**
5. Next Jacob and his family travelled to Mahanaim and he met angels there (Gen. 32:1-2). **Draw some angels at Mahanaim.** Jacob also sent messengers to the country of Edom to meet his brother Esau. **Draw men travelling from Mahanaim toward the direction of Edom.**
6. Jacob came to the brook Jabbok and sent his family across (Gen. 32:22). **Draw Jacob's family crossing the brook Jabbok.**
7. Jacob wrestled a man all night at Penuel. The man touched Jacob's hip and made it so that Jacob limped (Gen. 32:30). **Draw Jacob using a walking stick at Penuel.**
8. Genesis 33:17 After his meeting with Esau, Jacob travelled to Succoth and built a house and booths for his cattle. **Draw a house and booths and Succoth.**
9. Genesis 35:4 God told Jacob to travel to Bethel. On the way, they stopped at Shechem and they buried their strange gods and earrings under an oak. **Draw an oak tree at Shechem.**
10. Genesis 35:6-7 Jacob and his family then travelled to Bethel and built an altar. **Draw an altar at Bethel.**
11. Genesis 35:19-20 When they were almost to Bethlehem, Rachel died in childbirth. Jacob buried her there and set up a pillar. **Draw a pillar just outside of Bethlehem.**
12. Genesis 35:27 Jacob and his family came to his father at Hebron. **Draw Jacob and Isaac at Hebron.**
13. Genesis 46:1 Joseph sent for his father to come to Egypt. On the way to Egypt, Jacob stopped at Beersheba and offered sacrifices. Jacob also had a vision from God and God told him that he would see Joseph. **Draw Jacob sleeping at Beersheba.**
14. Jacob and his family settled in the land of Goshen in Egypt. **Draw Jacob's family tending flocks in Goshen** (on the small map or where Goshen is labeled on the large map).
15. Genesis 50:13 When Jacob died his sons and a band of Egyptians travelled back to the cave of Machpelah (near Hebron) and buried Jacob, as he had asked them to do. **Draw a cave near Hebron.**
