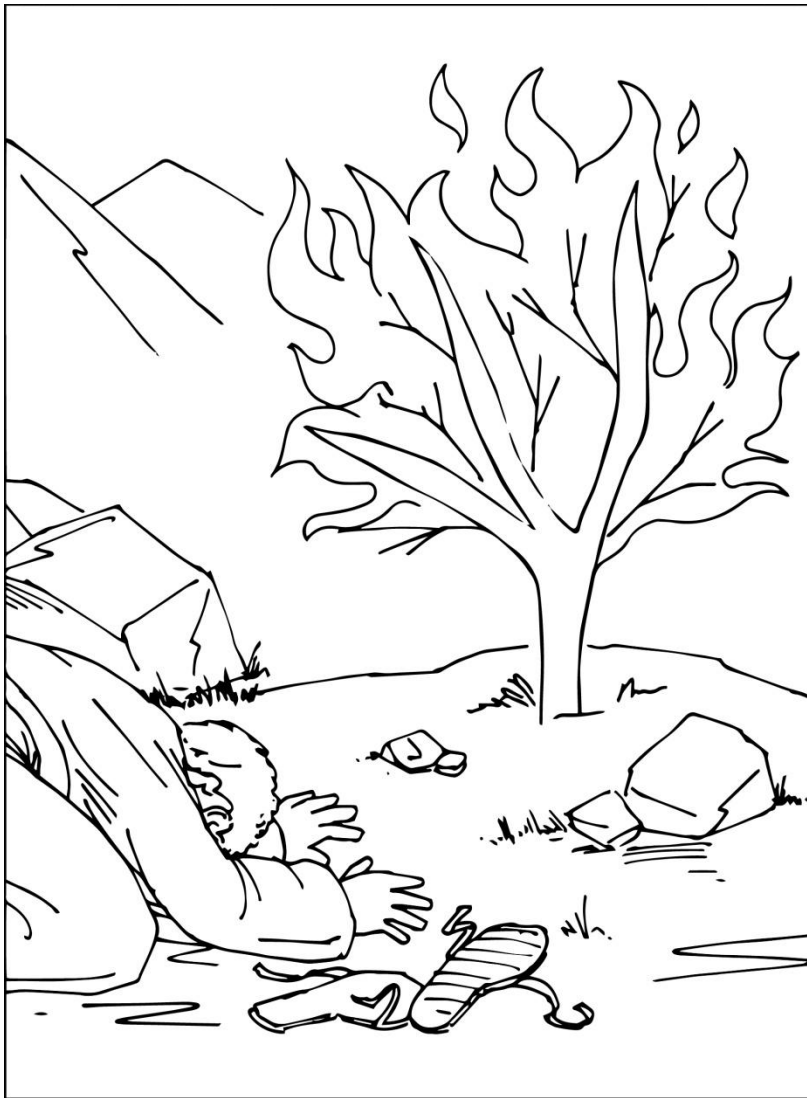

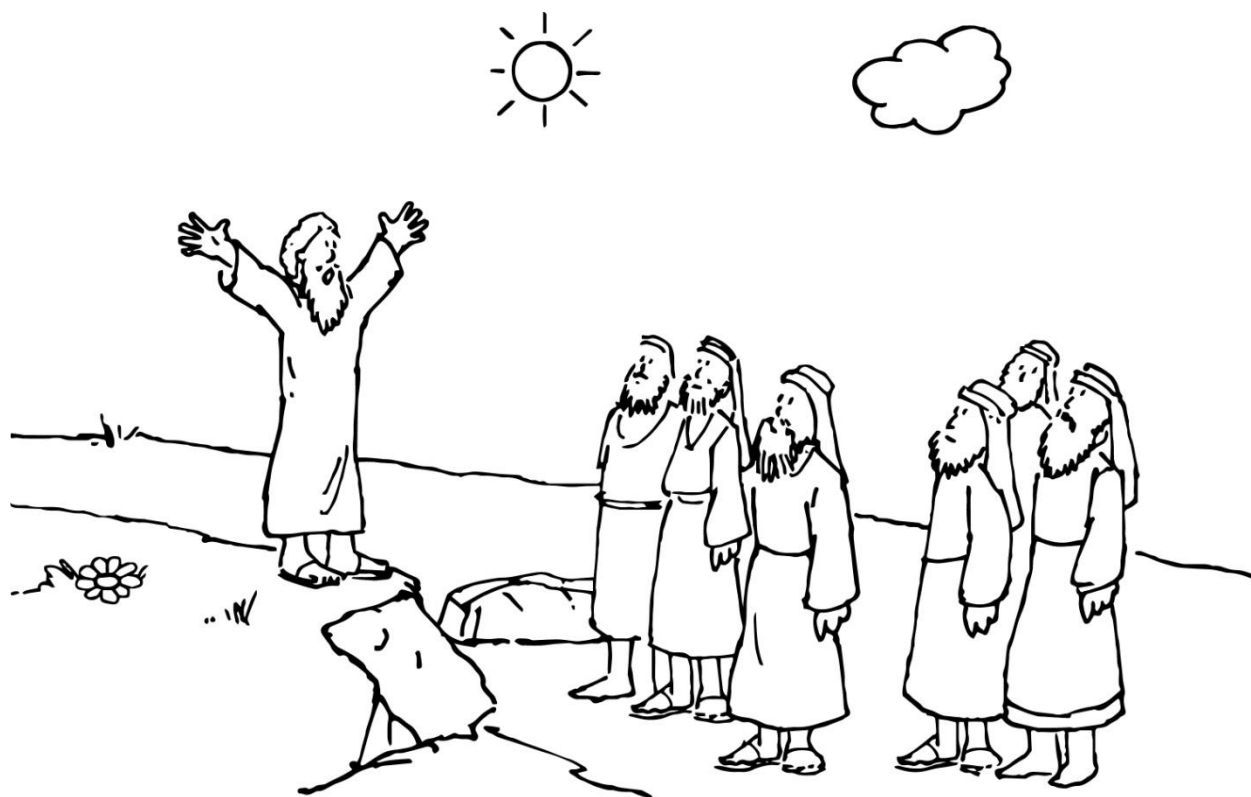

COMPLETING YOUR WORKBOOK

- This workbook will help you begin studying the life of Moses so that you understand the basic story and help you prepare for camp.
- The workbook is written using the King James Version (KJV) of the Bible. Feel free to look at other versions to help you understand the text.
- There are questions throughout the book with a **TQ** symbol, which stands for 'thought question' (or some like to call them tough questions!). These are designed to make you think about the answer, so don't expect to find the answer in a specific verse, just write down what you think.
- Feel free to color the pictures throughout the workbook.
- If you are having trouble with a question, put a star next to it and move on to the next question. When you have completed the section go back and try again. If you still can't get it, ask someone for help or email Uncle Jon and Auntie Becky

DIRECTIONS FOR USING A STRONG'S CONCORDANCE

1. Look up the word in the main concordance (the front section) just like you would in a regular dictionary.
2. Find the verse that contains the word you are looking for and look for a number to the right of the reference.
3. Use this number to look up the meaning in the back of the concordance. Because we are studying the Old Testament you will use the Hebrew dictionary in the back.

MINUTE MEDITATIONS

You will need to prepare a Minute Meditation to present at camp. You will need to choose one verse on which to base your minute mediation. A Minute Meditation is an opportunity for you to meditate or think about a verse from the study and share what you have learned in approximately one minute. You will read the verse and then tell what you have learned from the verse. You can share what you have learned about God and His character, or what you have learned about the people in the verse, or how this verse relates to other verses in the Bible, or how it relates to your life or a combination of these ideas. You will present this in your class or you can volunteer to present this in the main pavilion.

The chapters are broken up this year by the first letter of your last name. Please find the first letter of your last name below and choose a verse from one of the chapters listed next to that letter to use for your Minute Meditation.

PREPARATION FOR MORNING QUIZZES AND

MEMORY VERSES

There will be Bible readings and a memory verse from the life of Moses each day at camp. You will do these readings with your camp group and practice the memory verses. You will be quizzed on the verse and the readings the next morning. Below is the list of readings and verses for the quizzes each day. We suggest that you memorize these verses and read over these readings before camp to help you in your preparation for the week. There is one 'read only' section (marked below) which means that we will read these verses at camp to keep the flow of the story but you will not be quizzed on them in the morning quizzes.

Monday

6. Read some of the Psalms about the Exodus: Psalm 33, 66, 68, 74, 77, 78, 81, 85, 105, 107, 114, 135, and 136. Write out and illustrate a verse from one of these.
7. Write a journal as if you were Moses detailing the events that you went through and how you felt.
8. Memorize part of or write music to go with the Song of Moses in Exodus 15.

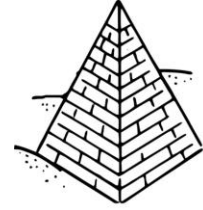

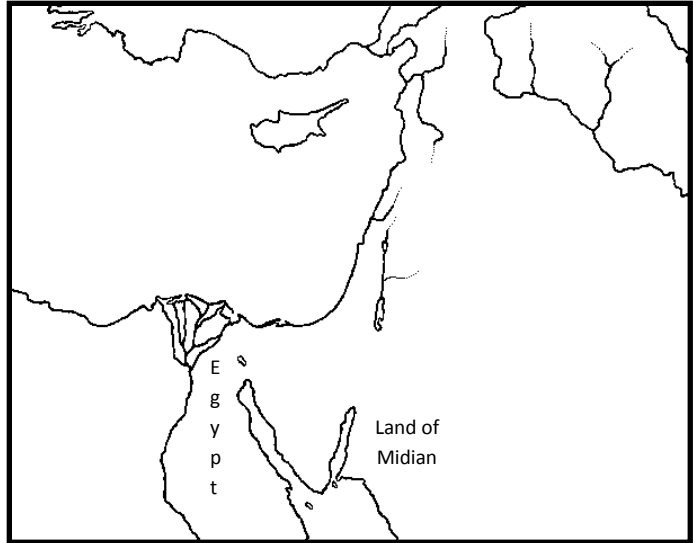

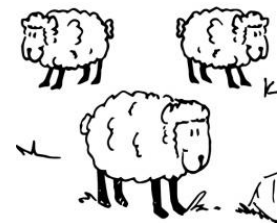

GOD MANIFESTATION

It might seem confusing that although what Moses saw was an angel, the one talking to him was God. But this is actually an important bible principle called "God Manifestation." *Manifestation* is a fancy word that means 'showing something'. "God Manifestation" means that angels – or even people – can show God to us. When someone is showing God, or talking for God, the Bible sometimes calls them "God", as if God is sharing His own special name. Later in the Bible, in the New Testament, someone came who could manifest God – show us God – perfectly. Can you think of who this might be?

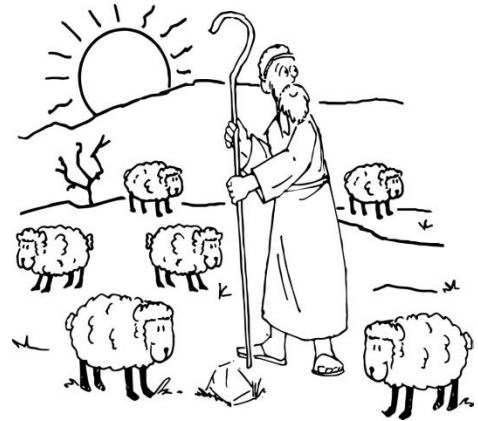

THE NAME OF THE LORD

COVENANT OF CIRCUMCISION

"Circumcision" is a procedure where a small piece of skin is cut off of a boy's body, usually when he is a baby. Long before Moses' time, God commanded Abraham to have all the boys born in his household circumcised as a sign that they were a part of God's special promises. If they weren't circumcised, it was like they weren't part of God's family. Today lots of people still circumcise their baby boys for health reasons. But now, as believers in Jesus, we have a different symbol to show when we join God's family. Do you know what it is?

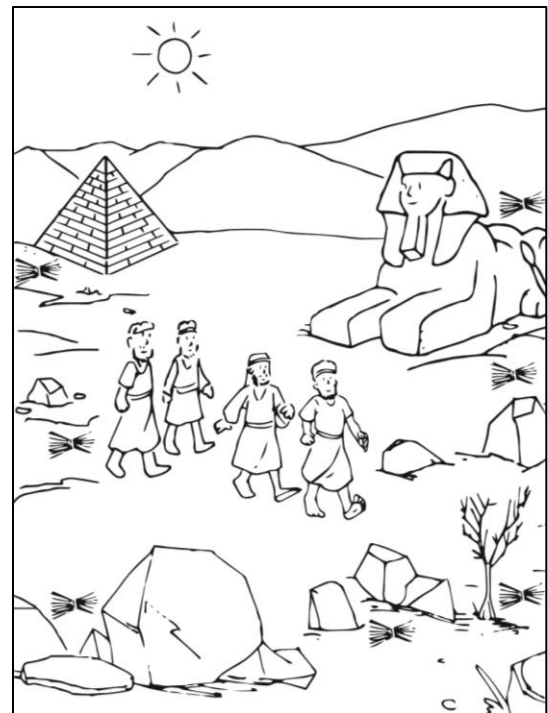

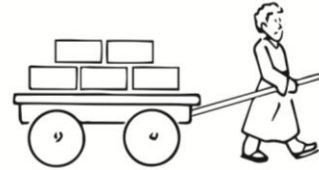

THE PROMISES

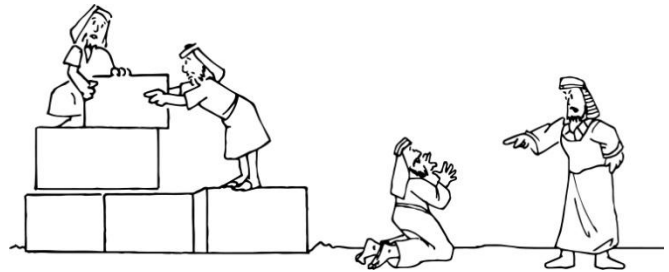

God made great promises to Abraham about a huge nation that would come from him, and a special land that those people would have, and an inheritance that would last forever. God repeated those promises to Isaac and Jacob about the families they would have. The children of Israel in Moses' time were still waiting for God's promises to be fulfilled. We are still waiting for some of them, all these years later! But we know that God always keeps His promises.

UNLEAVENED BREAD

Have you ever baked bread from scratch? If you have, then you know that part of the process is letting the dough sit for a while to rise. And when you put it in the oven, it rises some more. The reason for this is a natural chemical called "leaven", or sometimes today called "yeast". Without leaven, the bread would stay flat, like a cracker. At the first Passover, the children of Israel only had time to make those flat, cracker-type breads. Even today, Jews who celebrate Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread avoid all foods with leaven in them for the week, and only eat flat bread like Matzos.
