#### Introduction

In Isaiah 51:1-2, we are told: "Hearken to me, ye that follow after righteousness, ye that seek Yahweh: look unto the rock whence ye are hewn, and to the hole of the pit whence ye are digged. ### Intermediate Project

All intermediates are required to complete a special project, prior to arriving at camp, to be presented during class. Please choose **One** (1) subject from the list below. Note: you will find it easier to wait until you have completed the workbook before beginning your project. Some of the project options are quite easy, others are very challenging – choose one that you are comfortable with, and excited to learn about! **You may want to work together with your Advisor on your project – which is fine – and encouraged**. Just keep in mind that you will need to be able to explain your project (yourself) either to the class or to your teacher(s)

#### • Map: (choose one)

- a. Create a large map on poster board, label all of the locations mentioned during the life of Abraham. Mark all of the journeys of Abraham from the time he left Ur (as Abram) until his death.
- b. Create a large map on poster board, label all of the locations mentioned in Genesis 14. In different colors, trace the battles of the confederacy of Chedorlaomer, including their final defeat at the hands of Abram and his confederacy.

#### • Character Study: (choose one)

- a. Character study of Abraham, with examples from his life
- b. Character study of Sarah, with examples from her life
- c. Character study of Lot, with examples from his life
- d. Character study of Hagar, with examples from her life

#### • Theme Study: (choose one)

- a. Faith and Works. Romans 4:1-4 says that Abraham was justified by faith. James 2:21-26 says that Abraham was justified by works. Do these statements contradict each other? Explain with examples.
- b. Altars of Abraham. List all of the altars of Abraham, the places where they were constructed, and find other mentions of them in later Bible times.

#### • Comparisons and Types: (choose one)

- a. Prepare a poster that lists all of the ways in which Isaac is a type of Christ
- b. Prepare a poster that lists all of the ways in which the defeat of the confederacy of Chedorlaomer is a type of the battle of Armageddon. Look at Ezekiel 38/39, Joel 3, Revelation 16. Do not attempt this one on your own, get help from your Advisor, and ask them to work with you.
- c. Prepare a poster that explains Gal 4:22-31. Do not attempt this one on your own, get help from your Advisor, and ask them to work with you.

#### Promises and Faith:

a. Show how, as Abraham's faith grew, so did the extent and detail of Yahweh's promises to him

#### • Practical Lessons: (choose one)

a. After completing your study of the life of Abraham, write and explain the top 5 lessons you learned, and how it will help you in your daily life at home and at school

b. Obedience. What do we learn about obedience from Abraham, Sarah, and Isaac? How can you apply this in your life?

#### Find the Principle:

a. Look through the "Find the Principle" sections of your workbook, and **choose a question that you did not previously answer**. Provide a detailed answer, along with some ways the principle can be applied to your life. Find and provide relevant supporting passages from the Bible.

#### • Family Tree:

a. Prepare a poster of the complete **Family Tree of the house of Abraham**, starting with Noah. (you can stop with the generation of Joseph's sons).

#### • Chart of the Promises

a. Prepare a poster charting the promises made to Abraham, and explaining their significance



### Method of Study

The way in which we study our Bible makes a great difference in what we learn and can readily apply. Sometimes, we find ourselves frustrated or confused as to what the passage is talking about. More often than not, this is because we are not following a structured method. For our studies, we will follow a simple method of study, which has been adapted from Uncle Roger Lewis' which he talks about in his "How to be a Good Bible Student" class. The method is outlined below:



1. **Read the passage** completely, without stopping



2. **Learn** the passage by reading it carefully, asking questions. In this section, the questions will be very easy, straight from the verse



3. **Investigate** the passage by looking up the meanings of names, places, important cross-references, relevant facts, Bible themes, etc.



4. Find the Principle contained the passage. What general principles are taught? In this section, you will have a choice of questions. Answers are expected to be around a paragraph long. Be sure to indicate which questions you are answering.



5. **Apply the Lesson** – apply the principle to us. How can this instruct us in our every day life? In this section, you will have a choice of questions. Answers are expected to be around a paragraph long. Be sure to indicate which questions you are answering



#### Your Advisors

You should have at least one advisor to help you with your workbook when you get stuck on a question, or need help in any way. Preferably, this would be your Mom or Dad, but it could be your older brother or sister, grandparent, aunt or uncle, or someone at meeting who is willing to help you. If you can't find anyone to help, contact us – our number and e-mail address are below.

  - a. "How are you enjoying learning about Abraham?"
  - b. "Are you excited about Camp?"
  - c. "How is the workbook coming?"
  - d. "Are there any questions you need help on?"
  - e. "How are you doing compared to your plan?"
  - f. "What is your plan for the following week?"
  - g. "May I take a look at what you have done so far?"
- 5. Help me choose and get started on my project
- 6. Help me with any questions labeled "ADVISOR"
- 7. Make sure I have everything done before camp!

#### Guidelines

- You should be able to complete 4-6 pages per hour. If you worked on the workbook for 20 minutes per day, you would be done with loads of time to spare.
- Count the number of days from now until the week before camp: \_\_\_\_\_ now, divide that by the number of questions in your workbook: \_\_\_\_\_. That is the minimum number of questions you need to do per day.
- Example: If there are 80 days until the week before camp, and there were 480 questions, then 480 / 80 = 6. So, if you did 6 questions per day, you would be done well before camp starts.

- Use the guidelines above to help you set a weekly goal for how much you need and want
  to accomplish. Review your goal with your advisor(s) at the beginning and end of each
  week
- Use the goal chart on the next page

- Don't forget to pray to God for understanding!
- Use a PENCIL that way you can correct mistakes
- If a question is marked as "BONUS" you may consider it to be optional. There will be something special provided at camp for those who have correctly answered these questions
- If a question is marked as "ADVISOR" you should get help from your advisor(s). Even if you think you can answer it on your own, have them review your answer to be sure.
- If you get stuck on a question, put a star (\*) next to it and move on to the next. When you have completed the section, go back and try again. If you are still having trouble, ask for help from your advisor(s). #### If you find it hard




- 1. Read Joshua 24:2-3. Did Abram and his family worship Yahweh before they were called to leave UR? List all of the things from Gen. 12:1 they were to leave behind.
- 2. Throughout the Bible, and especially in Genesis, the names of people and places carry great significance. Use your concordance to look up the meaning of Nahor, Terah, Abram, and Lot. Show how each of their responses to the call of God could be summarized in the meaning of their name. (You may want to ask your advisor to help you)
- 3. When Abram entered the land, he found what people already there? Who were they descendants of? (Hint Genesis 9:18-26). Do you think this would have been a trial of Abram's faith?
- 4. In Gen. 12:2, Abram was told that he would become a great nation. In Gen. 12:7, Abraham was told that his seed would be given the land of Canaan. But Sarai and Abraham had a problem what was it? (Hint-Gen. 11:30)
- 5. The first mention of the land being promised to anyone is found in Genesis 12:7. Who was it first promised to (read carefully)? When is Abram first explicitly promised the land? Furthermore, the Bible tells us to "flee from idolatry" (1 Corinthians 10:14) but we cannot flee from something we don't know about! What is modern idolatry? What things take our hearts and minds away from God? List as many things as you can. Colossians 3:5 may help you refine your understanding!
2. Abram demonstrated great faith in leaving his old way of life behind, at the command of Yahweh. Immediately after crossing over the Euphrates and entering the land, he is faced with the fact that "the Canaanite was then in the land". He was further tried in verse 10 when now there is a drought in the land of promise! What does this tell us about the life of a believer? What can we expect in our lives, even after we are Baptized? Some verses that might help: 1 Peter 1:6-7; James 1:2-3,12; Hebrews 12:6,11; Acts 20:18-24
