Joshua 1-2: Be Strong and Of Good Courage Joshua Appointed Leader

Background to Joshua:

Joshua was born a slave in Egypt. He leaves when God delivers his people under the leadership of Moses. He leads the people of Israel in their first battle against Amalek after leaving Egypt. He is a faithful servant to Moses right from the beginning on Mount Sinai and all the way through Israel's journeys in the wilderness. Joshua brings a good report to Moses when he went to spy out the land of Canaan. God has Moses appoint Joshua as leader in front of Eleazar the Priest and the congregation. Moses gives him some of his authority to command the people and lead them. And now Moses gives his last words and dies on Mount Nebo. It is time for Joshua to take over and lead the people. It would be intimidating to take over from Moses after all the mighty signs God did through him. But God gives Joshua His Spirit to help him.

Deuteronomy 34:9-12

9 Now Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him; so the children of Israel heeded him, and did as the LORD had commanded Moses.

10 But since then there has not arisen in Israel a prophet like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face, **11** in all the signs and wonders which the LORD sent him to do in the land of Egypt, before Pharaoh, before all his servants, and in all his land, **12** and by all that mighty power and all the great terror which Moses performed in the sight of all Israel.

- 9** Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the LORD your God *is with you wherever you go.*"

Joshua 2: Rahab and the Spies

Joshua 2

1 Now Joshua the son of Nun sent out two men from Acacia Grove spy secretly, saying, "Go, view the land, especially Jericho."

So they went, and came to the house of a harlot named Rahab, and lodged there.



2 And it was told the king of Jericho, saying, "Behold, men have come here tonight from the children of Israel to search out the country."

3 So the king of Jericho sent to Rahab, saying, "Bring out the men who have come to you, who have entered your house, for they have come to search out all the country."

4 Then the woman took the two men and hid them. So she said, "Yes, the men came to me, but I did not know where they were from."

5 And it happened as the gate was being shut, when it was dark, that the men went out. Where the men went I do not know; pursue them quickly, for you may overtake them."

6 (But she had brought them up to the roof and hidden them with the stalks of flax, which she had laid in order on the roof.)

7 Then the men pursued them by the road to the Jordan, to the fords. And as soon as those who pursued them had gone out, they shut the gate.

8 Now before they lay down, she came up to them on the roof,

9 and said to the men: "I know that the LORD has given you the land, that the terror of you has fallen on us, and that all the inhabitants of the land are fainthearted because of you."







10 For we have heard how the LORD dried up the water of the Red Sea for you when you came out of Egypt, and what you did to the two kings of the Amorites who were on the other side of the Jordan, Sihon and Og, whom you utterly destroyed.

11 And as soon as we heard *these things*, our hearts melted; neither did there remain any more courage in anyone because of you, for the LORD your God, He *is* God in heaven above and on earth beneath.

12 Now therefore, I beg you, swear to me by the LORD, since I have shown you kindness, that you also will show kindness to my father's house, and give me a true token,

13 and spare my father, my mother, my brothers, my sisters, and all that they have, and deliver our lives from death."

Joshua 3-4: Israel Crosses the Jordan

Joshua 3

10 And Joshua said, “By this you shall know that the living God *is* among you, and *that* He will without fail drive out from before you the Canaanites and the Hittites and the Hivites and the Perizzites and the Girgashites and the Amorites and the Jebusites: **11** Behold, the ark of the covenant of the Lord of all the earth is crossing over before you into the Jordan. **12** Now therefore, take for yourselves twelve men from the tribes of Israel, one man from every tribe. **13** And it shall come to pass, as soon as the soles of the feet of the priests who bear the ark of the LORD, the Lord of all the earth, shall rest in the waters of the Jordan, *that* the waters of the Jordan shall be cut off, the waters that come down from upstream, and they shall stand as a heap.”

14 So it was, when the people set out from their camp to cross over the Jordan, with the priests bearing the ark of the covenant before the people, **15** and as those who bore the ark came to the Jordan, and the feet of the priests who bore the ark dipped in the edge of the water (for the Jordan overflows all its banks during the whole time of harvest), **16** that the waters which came down from upstream stood *still*, *and* rose in a heap very far away at Adam, the city that *is* beside Zaretan. So the waters that went down into the Sea of the Arabah, the Salt Sea, failed, *and* were cut off; and the people crossed over opposite Jericho. **17** Then the priests who bore the ark of the covenant of the LORD stood firm on dry ground in the midst of the Jordan; and all Israel crossed over on dry ground, until all the people had crossed completely over the Jordan.

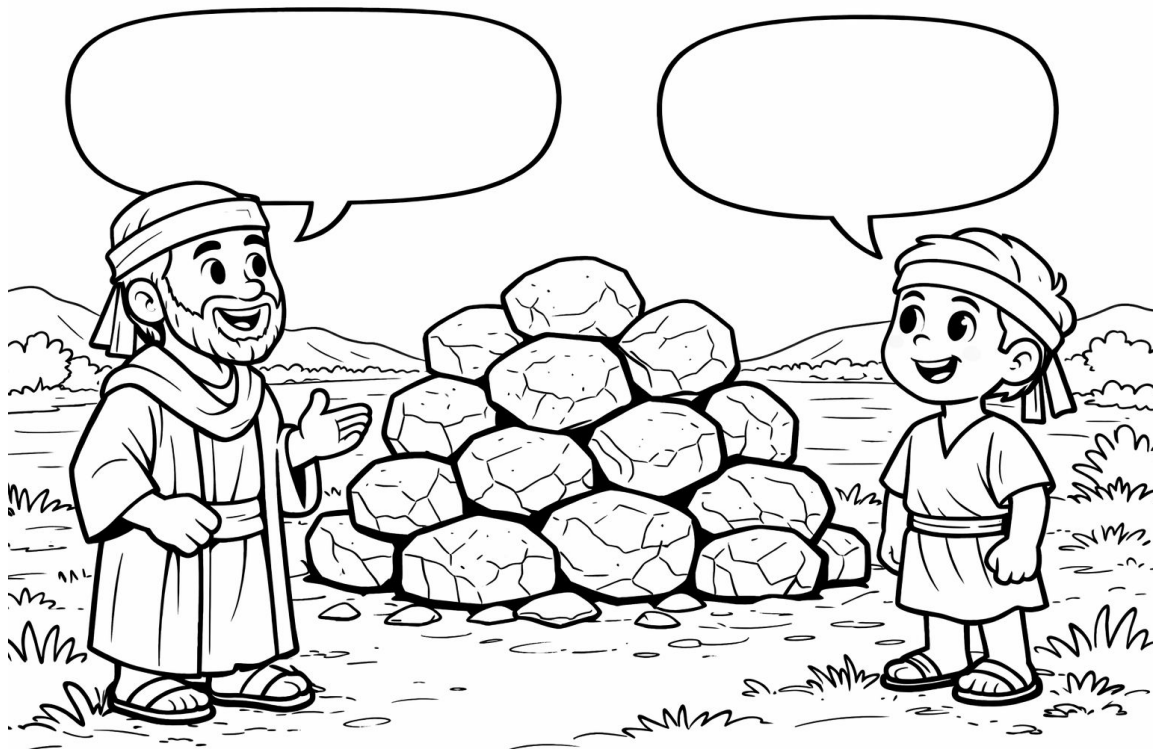
Joshua 4

A summary: After the people of Israel crossed the Jordan River on dry ground, God told Joshua to choose twelve men, one from each tribe. Each man picked up a large stone from the middle of the river where the priests had been standing with the Ark. They carried the stones to their camp and stacked them up. The stones were a special reminder. Someday, when children asked what they meant, the people would explain how God stopped the river so they would know God would be with them to conquer the land they were entering. Joshua also set up twelve stones in the river. When the priests stepped onto dry land, the water flowed again.

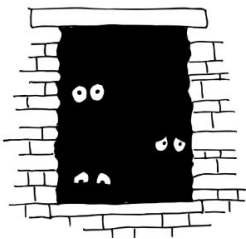
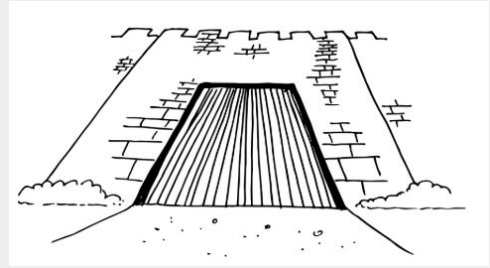


Joshua 6: Destruction of Jericho

God's Instructions

Joshua 6

1 Now Jericho was securely shut up because of the children of Israel; none went out, and none came in. **2** And the LORD said to Joshua: "See! I have given Jericho into your hand, its king, *and* the mighty men of valor. **3** You shall march around the city, all *you* men of war; you shall go all around the city once. This you shall do six days. **4** And seven priests shall bear seven trumpets of rams' horns before the ark. But the seventh day you shall march around the city seven times, and the priests shall blow the trumpets. **5** It shall come to pass, when they make a long *blast* with the ram's horn, *and* when you hear the sound of the trumpet, that all the people shall shout with a great shout; then the wall of the city will fall down flat. And the people shall go up every man straight before him."

8 So it was, when Joshua had spoken to the people, that the seven priests bearing the seven trumpets of rams' horns before the LORD advanced and blew the trumpets, and the ark of the covenant of the LORD followed them. **9** The armed men went before the priests who blew the trumpets, and the rear guard came after the ark, while *the priests* continued blowing the trumpets. **10** Now Joshua had commanded the people, saying, "You shall not shout or make any noise with your voice, nor shall a word proceed out of your mouth, until the day I say to you, 'Shout!' Then you shall shout." **11** So he had the ark of the LORD circle the city, going around *it* once. Then they came into the camp and lodged in the camp.

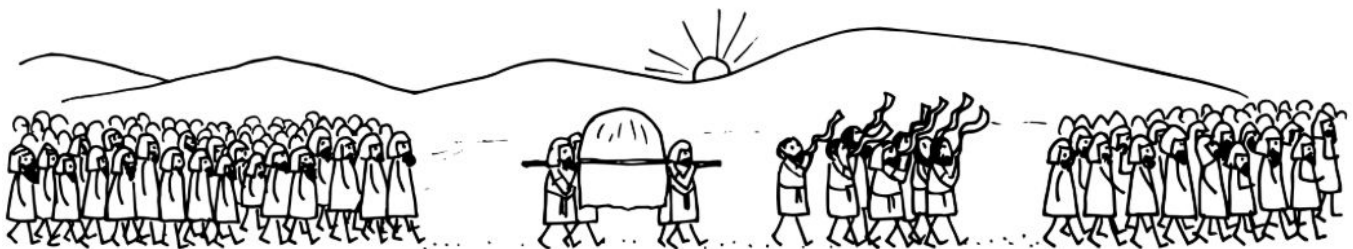

20 So the people shouted when *the priests* blew the trumpets. And it happened when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat. Then the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city. **21** And they utterly destroyed all that was in the city, both man and woman, young and old, ox and sheep and donkey, with the edge of the sword.

22 But Joshua had said to the two men who had spied out the country, "Go into the harlot's house, and from there bring out the woman and all that she has, as you swore to her." **23** And the young men who had been spies went in and brought out Rahab, her father, her mother, her brothers, and all that she had. So they brought out all her relatives and left them outside the camp of Israel. **24** But they burned the city and all that was in it with fire. Only the silver and gold, and the vessels of bronze and iron, they put into the treasury of the house of the LORD. **25** And Joshua spared Rahab the harlot, her father's household, and all that she had. So she dwells in Israel to this day, because she hid the messengers whom Joshua sent to spy out Jericho.

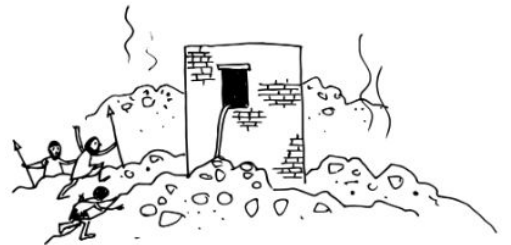

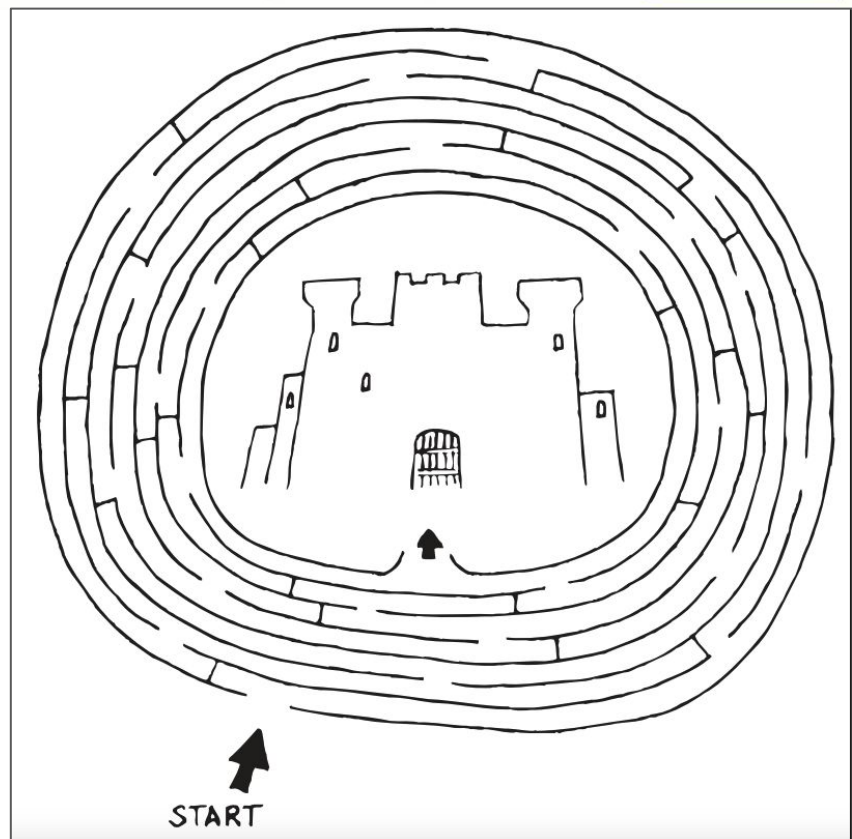

Joshua 7-8: The Battle Against Ai

Joshua 7

1 But the children of Israel committed a trespass regarding the accursed things, for Achan the son of Carmi, the son of Zabdi, the son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, took of the accursed things; so the anger of the LORD burned against the children of Israel.

2 Now Joshua sent men from Jericho to Ai, which is beside Beth Aven, on the east side of Bethel, and spoke to them, saying, "Go up and spy out the country." So the men went up and spied out Ai. **3** And they returned to Joshua and said to him, "Do not let all the people go up, but let about two or three thousand men go up and attack Ai. Do not weary all the people there, for *the people of Ai are few.*" **4** So about three thousand men went up there from the people, but they fled before the men of Ai. **5** And the men of Ai struck down about thirty-six men, for they chased them *from* before the gate as far as Shebarim, and struck them down on the descent; therefore the hearts of the people melted and became like water.

Joshua 23-24: The Death of Joshua

Joshua 23

1 Now it came to pass, a long time after the LORD had given rest to Israel from all their enemies round about, that Joshua was old, advanced in age. **2** And Joshua called for all Israel, for their elders, for their heads, for their judges, and for their officers, and said to them: "I am old, advanced in age. **3** You have seen all that the LORD your God has done to all these nations because of you, for the LORD your God *is* He who has fought for you. **4** See, I have divided to you by lot these nations that remain, to be an inheritance for your tribes, from the Jordan, with all the nations that I have cut off, as far as the Great Sea westward. **5** And the LORD your God will expel them from before you and drive them out of your sight. So you shall possess their land, as the LORD your God promised you. **6** Therefore be very courageous to keep and to do all that is written in the Book of the Law of Moses, lest you turn aside from it to the right hand or to the left, **7** *and* lest you go among these nations, these who remain among you. You shall not make mention of the name of their gods, nor cause *anyone* to swear *by them*; you shall not serve them nor bow down to them, **8** but you shall hold fast to the LORD your God, as you have done to this day. **9** For the LORD has driven out from before you great and strong nations; but as *for you*, no one has been able to stand against you to this day. **10** One man of you shall chase a thousand, for the LORD your God *is* He who fights for you, as He promised you."
